- (4) File a complete application and \$30.00 fee; and
- (5) Satisfy the Commission that they possess the requisite competency, honesty, truthfulness, integrity, good moral character, and general fitness, including mental and emotional fitness, necessary to protect the public interest and promote public confidence in the real estate brokerage business.
